## Agenda item: MFD w/g formation and Charter review

Discussion: Scope – Charter MFD w/g and list milestones for first project (Scan Service)

Direction – Desire to reflect Microsoft WS-Scan as closely as possible in our MFD model. Need Microsoft permission. Pete investigating.

Priority - Model Services before Device. Prioritize submission and control of jobs and documents

Goals - Model all services of MFD via staged process of achievable milestones.

Debate – Abstract modelling vs API. PSI vs IPP vs vanilla web service.

Consensus – For validating the model, a simple web-service binding (separate spec) is preferred over IPP.

Action – Pete to contact M. Sweet about IPP as a MFD protocol

Decision - Debated MPF vs MFD and... via poll... decided to use the term MFD.

Decision – Charter should include a restriction preventing definition of a Compound Service (eg, Scan-to-Email)

Decision - Charter will not allow definition of a new document format (eg, TIFF replacement)

Decision – Network topology will have no influence on the outcome of the Service definitions, which are to focus on however, the scope

Discussion:	<ul> <li>Scan Service Lifecycle – Pete diagrammed the Scan Service including job ticket, user, scanner etc on the flip chart.</li> <li>Job Creation – Options were proposed for start of Scan Job. For purposes of discussion we separated scan "ticketing" from scan job creation. We agreed that a scan job ticket may act like a "template" until associated with a job. The Scan Job is actually "created" at the time when processing instructions (scan job ticket) are bound to a "scan acquisition" (green button physical or virtual).</li> </ul>						
	Job Completion – The scan job ends when storage has been achieved.						
	<ul> <li>Concepts – The following concepts were discussed</li> <li>A scan job is scan acquisition stored at a storage location</li> <li>A scan ticket contains source, destination, image processing, format, and compression parameters and settings.</li> </ul>						
Conclusions:	This exercise represents the very initial efforts to hammer out concepts that will guide modelling of the MFD.
